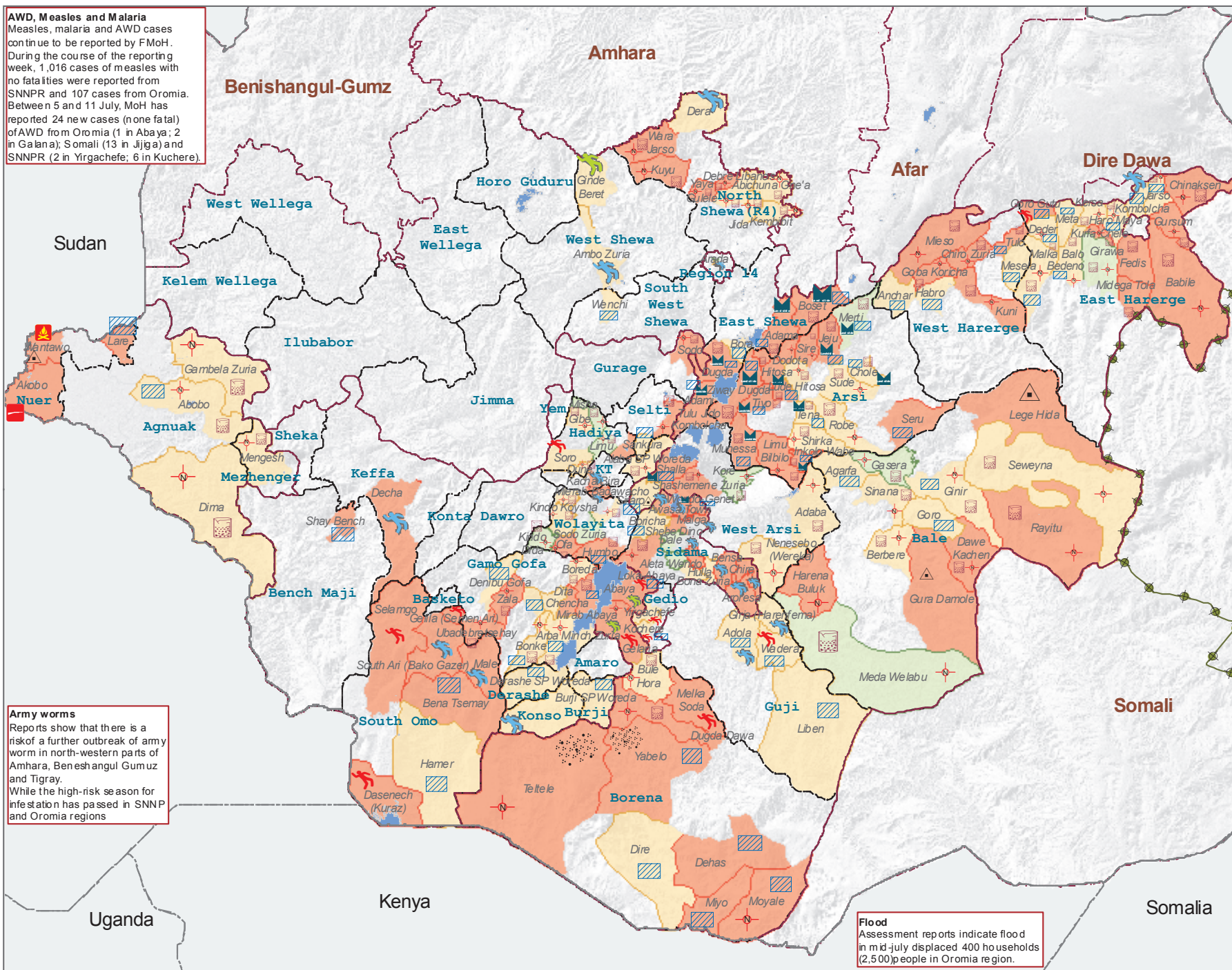


Addis Ababa, Oromia, SNNP and Gambella - Hot Spot Map

AWD, Measles and Malaria
Measles, malaria and AWD cases continue to be reported by FMOH. During the course of the reporting week, 1,016 cases of measles with no fatalities were reported from SNNPR and 107 cases from Oromia. Between 5 and 11 July, MoH has reported 24 new cases (none fatal) of AWD from Oromia (1 in Abaya; 2 in Galana); Somali (13 in Jijiga) and SNNPR (2 in Yirgacheffe; 6 in Kuchere).



Army worms
Reports show that there is a risk of a further outbreak of army worm in north-western parts of Amhara, Beneshangul Gumuz and Tigray. While the high-risk season for infestation has passed in SNNP and Oromia regions

Flood
Assessment reports indicate flood in mid-july displaced 400 households (2,500) people in Oromia region.
